Now Showing: SHIFT

MPA's first online juried exhibition, SHIFT, is currently on display on our website. **This evening** (Thursday, July 23) from 7-8:30pm, we will host a Virtual Artist/Juror Talk. RSVP here .

Juried by Henry L. Thaggert and Sarah Tanguy, the works featured in SHIFT focus on the concept of shift, change, or exchange--in position, direction, tendency, viewpoint, atmosphere, needs, dreams, schedules, interactions, environment, perspectives...

SHIFT features the work of 48 mid-Atlantic artists. Ms. Tanguy and Mr. Thaggert created two separate exhibits, each drawing from the same pool of works. SHIFT offers a window into the process of making an exhibition, shedding light on how jurors and curators respond to works of art, shaping a unique vision that comes to life through the choices they make.

SHIFT runs through August 27, 2020.






Join Us for MPA Summer Art Camps

MPA ArtReach Establishes New Partnership in DC's Shaw Community

Thanks to our newest MPA ArtReach partner, the Unique Learning Center (ULC) in Washington, D.C.'s Shaw neighborhood, for sharing some of their artwork (pictured above) inspired by one of our recent ArtReach fliers. In its 38-year history, ULC has grown from a small effort with eight children to a daily after-school and summer program reaching 40 students each year--changing the lives of children who might otherwise "slip through the cracks of the public school system."

Along with our Zoom classes for seniors through the Lewinsville Senior Center, and our new ServiceSource Zoom class, our weekly ArtReach activity fliers are distributed to more than 500 participants each week through our partner organizations, and posted on our Facebook page for everyone to share in the fun.
