Wholeheartedly embracing depth of color, texture, and line, Cortina is drawn back to painting for its immediate, direct, and therapeutic significance.

Beginningless Endless: Works by Shanthi Chandrasekar

Intensely curious by nature, Shanthi Chandrasekar creates work that explores the big questions of science and the natural world. Employing the mediums of drawing, painting, and sculpture, and tapping into her training in physics and psychology, Chandrasekar has created a vehicle for both her observational questioning and the wild journeys of her imagination. With astounding precision and skill, these works depict a perfect balance between our inner and outer worlds.

Images of *Vertical Interval* will be available on the MPA website beginning December 9. The Atrium Gallery exhibition, *Beginningless Endless*, will be available for viewing during MCC operating hours.


Classes scheduled to be offered in-person in our DuVal Studio (with special COVID policies and procedures, and pending current COVID pandemic conditions), include:
