



Classes meet on Thursdays from 7-9:30pm. • Portrait and Figure Painting with Jordan Xu (Online): Come and learn figure painting in oils, acrylics, or pastels from a live model. In this class, students will gain the knowledge of basic
- painting concepts and techniques such as value, color temperature, composition, and transition. Students will experiment with different approaches to starting a painting and the theories behind them. Step-by-step instructions will take participants through the entire process of a painting. Some drawing experience necessary. Classes meet Mondays from 7-9pm. • Vibrant Flower Paintings in Oil with Joyce Lee (Online): Capture the beauty of flowers with new techniques! In this class, students will learn how to capture the quality, the feeling, and the spirit
- of flowers while gaining exposure to new techniques. All levels welcome! Classes meet on Thursdays from 7–9:30pm. • Oil and Painting Studio with Tom Morris (DuVal Studio): A class designed for the continuing painting student at the beginning and intermediate level, students will gain continued practice with paint application, color mixing, and composition, with a focus on thematic development.


