

## • Teen Painting -- NEW!! (Online) with Pamela Saunders: Join other teens for a calm and relaxing painting class. Students will paint with acrylic on canvas boards. Each class will focus on techniques in various brush strokes, color-mixing and blending to create original art, paint party style art, and more! No previous drawing or painting experience necessary. Classes meet Fridays

from 5-6:30pm beginning April 23.

• Paper Making Series (DuVal Studio) with Jennifer Lillis: This class takes students from pulp to paper in creating their own paper. Students will learn how to form, press, and dry sheets of handmade paper, working to create a variety of paper to be used for the upcoming series or for their own personal projects. Classes meet Wednesdays from 6-8pm beginning 3/24.


