Fall/Winter Exhibitions Debut at McLean Project for the Arts "Vibrant Matter: Works from Wood" and "Growth Patterns: Work by Amelia Hankin" Opening Exhibition Reception Nov. 14

McLean, VA: McLean Project for the Arts (MPA) will open its two new fall exhibitions—*Vibrant Matter: Works from Wood* and *Growth Patterns: Work by Amelia Hankin*—with an Opening Exhibition Reception on Thursday, November 14, 2024.

"We are delighted to feature two exhibitions in our MPA Galleries during the late fall/early winter time period that are curated by our Assistant Curator and Gallery Manager, Jennifer Lillis," said Nancy Sausser, MPA Curator and Artistic Director. "Jennifer recently received her MFA from George Mason University, where she currently teaches printmaking classes. With a special interest and expertise in both drawing and printmaking, she has put together two exhibits that reflect these processes."

In *Growth Patterns: Works by Amelia Hankin*, Hankin uses the simple tools of the drawing process—graphite, paper, eraser—to create compositions that bring together natural objects and structures to create spaces full of meaning and content. These images refer to the cycles of birth, regeneration and death, in all their nuanced complexity and beauty.

In addition to the November 14 Opening Exhibition Reception, MPA will host a Tea & Talk on Wednesday, December 4, 2024 at 11am. All events are free and open to the public.
